# Parental Responsibility

Parental involvement is the key to a child's success. ## Insurance

Each child is covered by secondary accident insurance through the Southern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. If child is to be left at the meeting without the parent a Completion of the Health Record will be required at registration.

In compliance with our insurance guidelines, your child is fully supervised at all times. In order to provide adequate supervision, enrollment is limited by the current staff ratio. Because of insurance guidelines, all staff members must be members of the Rolling Hills Seventh-day Adventist church in good standing, and have been screened by the conference by submitting a Volunteer form.

# Information

The Rolling Hills Discovery Club is a non-profit youth organization operated by the Rolling Hills Seventh-day Adventist Church. The club is financed by member fees, church subsidies and private donations.

#### MEMBERSHIP:

Membership is open to all boys and girls, ages 1–5, on a space available basis, regardless of race, religion or national origin. Please contact the coordinator as soon as possible to have your child's name placed on the waiting list. Children under one year of age may attend the meetings free of charge.

#### **ENROLLMENT:**

The Discovery year is divided into two sessions. Enrollment takes place in July and the first meeting is the second Monday in August. The mid-year enrollment takes place in December and the first meeting is the second Monday in January. Children will be admitted on an ongoing basis subject to available space and will pay the entire fee for the session.

#### **MEETINGS:**

Meetings are held on 2nd Monday afternoon, from 4:15 p.m. to 5:45 p.m. in the Cradleroll (1,2 year olds) and Kindergarten (3, 4, and 5 year olds) Sabbath School rooms. Dinner is served in the Fellowship hall from 5:45 p.m. to 6:45 p.m. It is not included in the fees, but is funded on the honor system by donations .

#### ATTENDANCE:

Every Discoverer is expected to attend all Monday meetings. Parents are expected to attend the Baby Birds meeting with their children. Children are expected to come in Dress Uniform on the first Sabbath of the month. Children will also present the Sabbath School Program from 9:30 am—9:45 on selected months. Check the calendar for current dates.

Special recognition will be given for perfect attendance. Certificates will be awarded. Iron on patches will also be put on the child's scarf.

#### FIELD TRIPS:

One combined field trip is planned each session. This is a family activity usually held on a Sunday. Check the calendar for current dates.

# Program & Recognition

PRE-DISCOVERY CLASS: (For 1 and 2 year olds)

The Baby Birds program is a brand new concept originated by the Rolling Hills Seventh-day Adventist Church Children's Ministry. It uses the church's Pre-adventurer curriculum as a model to develop a program for the younger children. A sample of the activities include:
